THE SUPER GIRLS FROM GERMANY just cannot be stopped. They opened again with the best game of all the teams,972. Daniela Gruber and Dorothea Weiche were the DYNAMIC DUO this with 220 each. Häfker added 205. Sweden playing on the same pair of lanes lost ground by a further17 pins but it could have been worse had not Birgitta Linder assembled a splendid 233 game as the major position in this 955 total. Only other team to shoot a respectable game were Denmark with 940 spearheaded by lead-off woman Elsa Andersen on 224. Leaders at the two-thirds marks were 1-Germany 3866, 2-Sweden 3728, 3-France 3708, 4-Finland 3554, 5-Denmark 3538, and 6-Great Britain 3537.

Only one team played better than Germany in the fifth game overall and the second game to-day. That team was France This took them past Sweden into second place Jacqueline Moulenac 221 headed a forceful French trio that also included Pocino (206) and Annie Francois (202). Pocino has good memories from Tali being the European Corporate all-events champion here in 1975. She now again has a chance to leave Finland with pleasant memories. Germany is running away with the title taking the most overwhelming victory in the tournament so far. In their 959 game Gruber had 216 which means 436 in two, some going. Good back to back games is also the trademark of Else Andersen of Denmark at this She opened with 224 and added 213 in the second Belgium also had a good 927 now. France got bronze with Moulenac 213 in the last and a 604 total. Two 137 games in the last stanza spoiled the chances for France to get medals of a brighter shine.

Finland ran in a distant fourth to the disappoint of local fans. Jeanny van der Looverbosch for Netherlands on 234 had the sharpest finish after Brosch.
